


President's Message Cont'd from page 1:

Nominations Committee Seeks Candidates



If anyone has a conference site in mind, contact me. Keep in mind the need for adequate manufacturers booths. (214 booths for 1991)

*Ethics: MidEast Region needs to re-submit a name to be selected for "blind draw", to serve on the committee. Facts presented: (1) Board of Directors is accountable (could be sued) as representatives of the IAET. (2) Being on the Board is a privilege, not a right. (3) Board members must act in best interest of the association. (4) A conflict of interest can be considered either an actual or perceived issue. (5) Code of Ethics to be developed by committee.

Highlights of Strategic Marketing Plan for IAET

• *Mission Statement: "The IAET Marketing Plan will communicate to existing and potential members the benefits of IAET membership in a way that will create increasingly involved current members and new active members."

*The Message: "Patients have the inalienable right to state of the art stoma, wound/skin, and incontinence care, and ET nurses are uniquely qualified to insure that these services are provided."

*Basic Themes: (1) ET nursing is on the cutting edge of the historical trend toward cost-effective and preventive healthcare. (2) ET nurses are concerned about, and want to provide health care for, the huge underserved population; seniors, handicapped, shut-ins, etc. (3) ET nursing is a highly skilled, highly trained professional. (4) The ET nurse is cost effective member of the preventative health care team.

A task force was assigned to identify target groups, and person felt important to align ourselves with in efforts to promote our specialty. A continued marketing plan will be developed, and a monthly action report will be reported upon by way of the President's newsletter.

The IAET will be co-sponsoring an information dissemination conference with the National Pressure Ulcer Advisory Panel and the Association of Rehab Nurses. The conference will be held in Washington, D.C., March 5 - 8, 1991. ET nurses on the panel are Betty Jackson and Millie Kemp.

Kristy Wright was invited to provide testimony to the panel on incontinence in Washington, D.C., in October. She presented verbal and written testimony to the panel with a focus on the role of the nurse in care of the incontinent adult.

The IAET is on the Health Policy Committee which is a part of the National Federation for Specialty Nursing Organizations. The group is in the process of developing a legislative platform for specialty nursing.

The ANA has revised the pamphlet "Liability Prevention & You". Free copies are available through ANA by calling 800-274-4262. Up to 25 copies may be received free.

HCFA has extended Medicare coverage for durable medical equipment to include air-fluidized beds. Coverage is limited to patients who meet specific criteria.

The IAET has contributed \$500 to Signa Theta Tau International Center for a nursing scholarship. Our contribution will be acknowledged on a brick in the center's commemorative wall in Indianapolis, Indiana.

A Senate Committee reported that only 1% of product problems are reported even though 37% of product problems could cause serious injury or death. It is our responsibility to report problems as they occur. (Address: Medical Device and Laboratory Product Problem Reporting Program, United States Pharmacopeial Convention, Inc., 12601 Twinbrook Parkway, Rockville, MD 20852) I have guidelines for reporting the problem if you're interested.

No Regional officer may concurrently hold an IAET office." (Article V, Section II). What are the responsibilities of the secretary? These may also be found in the By-laws: Article V, Section IX.

Any materials received after March 1 will not be considered. Once received, you will receive a confirmation letter along with a consent form for you to sign. - I. That the Conference work positively towards acceptance by professional organizations (A.N.A., A.M.A.) and other allied health organizations.

MIDEAST REGION DELEGATES' REPORT

Condensed Committee Report to the Membership: I would like to thank all of the delegates and our alternate Terri Boyd for attending the Conference in Atlanta in June. They all worked very hard and put in many hours of preparation for the 1991 House of Delegates meeting.

The major issues discussed prior to attending the House of Delegates meeting were those pertaining to name change, the IAET NEWS and the marketing plan for the IAET. A survey was given to the membership at the membership meeting as a basis of discussion at a meeting held immediately after by the MidEast delegates. The survey touched briefly on each of these issues and comments were also written in.

Two findings from the survey were absolutely clear. One was that the MidEast Region was strongly opposed to a name change, at least for now. The second was that most of the general membership found the IAET NEWS beneficial to disseminate information.

The issue of name change never became an issue this year at the House of Delegates, so no action needed to be taken, although it very well could have so it was best that the delegates were prepared with their responses.

Kristy Wright was presented with a letter of support from the MidEast Region regarding the IAET NEWS.

The issue that was most troublesome and allconsuming for the delegates, even until the very last minute at the House of Delegates, was that of the Marketing Plan. There were two specific topics of particular concern. They were the definition of an Active Member and the expansion of ET nursing educational opportunities, which would include the development of three modules (wound, ostomy and incontinence).

The delegates were under the impression that the second issue, regarding the development of modules would be up for debate with a vote to be taken. This was not the case, however the floor was open for comments and suggestions, and plans for revising the ETNEPs will be underway.

The first troublesome issue, that of redefining the Active member was up for a vote at the House of Delegates meeting. To better prepare the IAET members for this vote, the conference floors were flooded with resource people wearing "ASK ME~' buttons and the officers of the IAET prepared "ASK ME" sessions for membership attendance to provide clarification of the marketing plan's components.

Many people were outraged at the idea of the new proposed definition of Active Member("any RN who supports the mission and goals of the IAET. They are required to pay dues and shall have all privileges of membership.") and others believed that since we voted our national officers into their positions, we should trust them and support them with our votes. The MidEast Region general membership leaned against supporting this, although the survey results showed a narrow margin between those supporting the proposal and those not supporting it.

At the MidEast Region membership meeting, Ruth Bryant encouraged the membership and delegates to attend "Ask Me" sessions and address any and all concerns to the designated resource individuals.

Once our members attended the "Ask Me" sessions, read more thoroughly the May 1991 IAET NEWS, and obtained more written and verbal information from the designated resource

people, the feelings seemed to switch in the direction of supporting the new definition of Active Member. At this point, the delegates tried to make sure that informed opinions were most seriously addressed, not just those based only on emotion The result being that the delegates also turned from having a majority of non-supporters for the membership definition change to a majority of supporters. The new definition of Active Member was then passed in the House of Delegates.

I am proud of this group for their commitment in searching and probing for the most information possible pertaining these issues. I would also like to thank Brenda Kerschbaum, Paula Toth, Kristy Wright, Ruth Bryant, Rosemarie VanIngen, and Ethel Pryor for much time spent with the delegates offering different perspectives.

BOARD VOTES TO FULFILL VACANCY







addressed the topic of professionalism to better prepare us for meeting with our Medicare intermediaries.

Very soon, each of our Region's state GAC chairs will be receiving a manual of information from our national GAC chair, Jill Morris. This manual is to be used as a tool to educate our intermediaries in each of our states. State chairs, please feel free to delegate some of this activity to other willing ETs in your area. The goal is to make certain that the intermediaries understand the new HCFA codes, the application of certain supplies and to make them aware of the ET's role. NURSE IN WASHINGTON PROGRAM

I wanted to give you a short report on the Nurse in Washington Program (March 10-15, 1991).

I want to thank the MidEast Region for the opportunity to attend the Nurse in Washington Internship Program. It was an experience as I've never had before and it certainly increased my awareness of the legislative process and the importance of each of us to take an active role in this process.

There were a total of seventy participants in the program. The ET nursing group was the largest specialty group there with seven ET nurses attending. I certainly agree with Freda Miller who represented the Rocky Mountain Region when she said this experience was exciting and overwhelming.

NIWI's guiding principle is "BLESSED ARE THE FLEXIBLE, FOR THEY NEVER GET BENT OUT OF SHAPE". And this principle was tested many times as we tried to find our way around the hill,

find our state representatives, make appointments that weren't blocks apart, attending meetings in Maryland as well as attend congressional hearings.

The program was excellent. The speakers held your interest (not that you understood everything), and they gave us much information on the health care issues facing the nation today. Health care in 1991 will cost 765 billion dollars, and will double to 1.5 trillion by the end of the century if we continue at the existing rate. The overriding forces relevant to health care cost are accessibility, and quality. Presently, only 4% of the health care dollar is spent on prevention.

The new budget and allocations for 1992, 1993, and 1994, were established to control spending. The budget is divided into three components: domestic, international, and defense. Health care falls under domestic. Legislators determine how the allocated monies will be spent. This is important to our specialty at a time when we are seeking reimbursement. The underlying theme when we talked to our legislators or their assistants was "We will have to take money from another program to consider this".

The budget deficit is 3,097 trillion dollars. It would cost each American \$12,400 to retire the debt. The new budget eliminates 238 domestic programs and cuts funding for 109 additional programs. Health related programs cuts include a 76% decrease in health professional education, a 9% decrease in maternal child health block grants, and a 92% decrease in Indian health services. There is an 11% increase in prevention care block grants, and 11% increase in the W.I.C. program. Health care goals are directed to increase the span of the health life, reduce health disparities, and achieve access to preventative services.

We were able to meet with Pamela Mittelstadt, RN, MPH, Assistant Director of the Congressional & Agency Relations for the ANA.

Pam gave us each a copy of the ANA's 1991 Legislative and Regulatory Initiatives for the 102nd Congress. Pam stated if ET Nurses expected to receive reimbursement, we must examine the educational levels of nurse specialists that are currently being reimbursed, i.e. nurse anesthetist and nurse practitioners. Both of these specialties have up to two years advanced education. Also, we must work on a grass roots level, volunteer to serve on advisory committees for your legislators (State & Federal) attend town meetings, express your concerns, and take the time to know where your legislator stands on issues that are important to you. Vote to support your candidate. One vote can make a difference. Let them know you are an RN "VOTER".

You would be very proud to know that there are many nurses on the hill who work as assistants to the legislators and/or are active in the health care policy development process. There are many Masters and PhD prepared nurses working for quality care.

Mary Wakefield, PhD, RN, representing The Agency for Health Care Policy and Research, an agency created in 1989, spoke to inform us on the goals of the Agency. These goals are to facilitate the development of clinical guidelines, standards of quality, performance measures, and review criteria. Prediction, prevention, and early treatment of pressure ulcer management in adults as well as urinary incontinence are only two of seven guidelines currently under consideration.

I was also fortunate to attend the March 6-9,

1991, NPUAP meeting in Arlington, VA, and was impressed to see how this agency was willing to work with the IAET and the Assoc. of Rehab. Nurses in reviewing research guidelines for the prediction, prevention and early treatment of pressure ulcers. I was also impressed with the open forum and the Agency's response to the recommendations made by the participants at this meeting. Participants at the meeting were able to make recommendations for the changes in the guidelines, as well as discussing how the implementation can best be achieveed in different settings and how these guidelines can best be evaluated for effectiveness.

According to Continuing Care April, 1991, "these guidelines were to be presented by the Agency to Congress in May for final approval. While implementation will be voluntary over the next two years, the Agency expects reimbursement for pressure ulcer prevention to follow closely behind the implementation of the guidelines".

The most shocking thing for me to learn at this meeting was the panel read over 10,000 articles from journals and industry on accepted treatments that we use every day in our practice and yet there were less than 200 articles that were actually based on empirical data to support our methods practice. (Pam Mettestadt is the IAET liason to ANA)


