A Message From Our President . . .



The new century is here, the Y2K bug was wiped out before it got here and the flu bug has hit. It amazes me how much we worry about things we cannot change. One thing we as ET/WOC nurses can change is care for our patients. The Balanced Budget Act and resulting cuts in Medicare reimbursement have impacted all of us. Many of us spend hours trying to find a DME who is still carrying ostomy supplies, let alone accepting assignment or contracting with specific insurance carriers.

We need to be more politically active, communicating with our legislators. When I was in Washington at NIWI, I discovered how little our representatives (and the people who run their offices and do the legwork) know about patients with ostomies, wounds, or incontinence. The American Diabetes Association has a wonderful marketing and education plan. Ten years ago, people knew little about diabetes and costs associated with glucose monitoring supplies. Our patients and their nurses need to be actively educating the public and decision-makers about their needs. The MER has an active Government Affairs Committee. Chair Glenna Altizer is quite knowledgeable and will assist you to contact the proper legislators. The next time you are frustrated by "red tape" take ten minutes to call or write your legislator. They do listen. The "squeaky wheel" gets the grease.




- Eligibility Requirements: 1. Active member of Mid-East Region of WOCN.

- 3. Applications will be competitively reviewed by 3 members of the Research Committee.



Article IV Meetings Section IV Special Meetings:

Special meetings of the Region may be called in either of two ways.

Article V Officers Section V Vacancy:

If an office shall become vacant, the Board of Trustees shall appoint an eligible person to fill such vacancy until a regular election for that office is held.

Article V Officers Section X Treasurer's Duties:

At the expiration of the term of office, the Treasurer shall deliver over to their successor, all books, money and other property in their charge or, in the absence of a successor, the Treasurer shall deliver such properties to the President within sixty (60) days of completion of term of office.

Article VI Board of Trustees Section II Trustee Structure:

Article VI Board of Trustees Section IV Term:
